






Optional Identifier

For easy identification of which modules are yours when collecting after a show, it is advised to include a unique pattern of three plates in each corner of your module below ground level as indicated here.


The pattern should be the same on each corner of each module you build. Let us know what pattern you will use before building and we will make a note of it so that we don't get multiple people using the same pattern.











Alternative 32 x 32 Base Section for models that will span multiple standard 16 x 16 Base Sections























